What does an inspector do?

Roof

HVAC System

HVAC stands for heating, ventilation, and cooling. The inspector will look for proper function of any of the systems that are installed, likely turning on the air conditioner or heater to make sure it works.

Plumbing

The inspector will look at sinks, toilets, bathtubs, outdoor spigots, and plumbing pipes to make sure all of these items work.

Appliances

The age and condition of appliances will be inspected (refrigerator, stove, oven, washer, dryer, etc.).

Electrical

The inspector will check the switches, if outlets have been grounded, and if there are any obvious malfunctions.
